The Māori Secondary Scholarships are financed from private bequests and trusts set up by individuals or businesses. In addition, the Māori Education Trust administers scholarships on behalf of other agencies. The scholarships are available to Māori secondary students who meet **all** of the following criteria:

THE STUDENT MUST:

- be of New Zealand Māori descent;
- send a verified deposit slip, cancelled cheque or bank statement with a printed bank account number with the application; and
- send the fully completed application form in on time.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION:

- There are ten Ti Maru Māori Trust & MET Overseas Scholarships available for the second 2010 round.
- Please ensure you have used the 2010 application form.
- All applications must be sent to the Māori Education Trust on or before the closing date. This will be checked by the date stamped by the postal company (**Note:** Contact your local post shop for the time your mail box is cleared to ensure it will be date stamped for the correct date.)
- **No missing or corrected information will be accepted after the closing date.** The earlier you submit your application the more chance you have of being able to resubmit information if your application is incomplete or ineligible (**Note:** The Trust cannot guarantee that you will have the chance to resubmit.)
- Do **not** fax or e-mail this application form or any other supporting documentation to the Māori Education Trust. Only original copies of the application form will be accepted.
